
Natural objects make wonderful art materials. Make a minibeast using natural materials, e.g. twigs, leaves, straw, grass, etc.



Use this easy salt dough recipe to create a salt dough minibeast:

- 1 cupful of plain flour (about 250g)
- half a cupful of table salt (about 125g)
- half a cupful of water (about 125ml)
- 1. Preheat the oven to its lowest setting and line a baking sheet with baking parchment.
- 2. Mix the flour and salt in a large bowl. Add the water and stir until it comes together into a ball.
- 3. Transfer the dough to a floured work surface and shape into your chosen minibeast.
- 4. Put your finished items on the lined baking sheet and bake for 3 hrs or until solid.
- 5. Leave to cool and then paint.

Go on a minibeast hunt, making a list of the minibeasts you find. Choose 6 different minibeasts from your list. How could you sort these minibeasts? Create a classification key like the one shown below.



I would like you to imagine you are a professional biologist who has just discovered an exciting new species of minibeast. You could:

- Create a poster draw and label your new minibeast. What name will you give your animal?
- Create a fact file including information on where in the world you made the discovery, the
 minibeast's habitat, what your new minibeast eats, what eats your minibeast and its behaviour.
