

Church of England Primary School Pupil Premium Report 2018-19

Overview

The Pupil Premium (PPM) initiative is designed to ensure that funding to tackle disadvantage reaches pupils who need it most. The funding is allocated for pupils who are:

- Eligible for Free School Meals
- Have been eligible for Free School Meals at any point in the previous six years, even if they are not currently eligible (known as Ever 6)
- Looked after children (LAC) who are in care, fostered or adopted
- Have parents currently in the armed forces.

For our Pupil Premium pupils, we aim to:

- Improve their levels of attainment and progress, narrowing the gap between the highest attaining pupils in our school and those who begin at a disadvantage
- Enable them to have full access to our curriculum and to extra-curricular activities, including educational visits and clubs
- Give them the skills they need to flourish even after they have moved on to secondary education.

Barriers to future attainment

The percentage of those achieving age related expectations continues to be higher generally for those who do not receive Pupil Premium funding compared with those who do, although the gaps are closing and the pupils receiving Pupil Premium funding in Year 6 SATs were in line or above.

Lower progress and attainment in writing, particularly with PP children in KS2 currently.

The multiple disadvantages of pupils (e.g. SEN/CP/EAL) who are also eligible for PP which affect the rate of progress and can have a detrimental effect on their academic progress, preventing them from achieving age related. Progress can be slow.

Parenting support – Lack of parental involvement/engagement with some pupils who are eligible for PP may lead to lack of progress across the school.

Mental health and resilience of children and their parents.
