

Pupil Premium Report 2019-20

Overview

The Pupil Premium (PPM) initiative is designed to ensure that funding to tackle disadvantage reaches pupils who need it most. The funding is allocated for pupils who:

- Are eligible for Free School Meals
- Have been eligible for Free School Meals at any point in the previous six years, even if they are not currently eligible (known as Ever 6).
- Are looked after children (LAC) in care, fostered or adopted
- Have parents currently in the armed forces.

For our Pupil Premium pupils, we aim to:

- Improve their levels of attainment and progress, narrowing the gap between the highest attaining pupils in our school and those who begin at a disadvantage.
- Enable them to have full access to our curriculum and to extra-curricular activities, including educational visits and clubs.
- Give them the skills they need to flourish even after they have moved on to secondary education.

Overview of last year's spending

The total amount allocated to Pupil Premium in 2018-2019 was £30,640. At the start of the year, the number of children eligible for Pupil Premium funding was 16 and numbers increased during the year.

Summary of impact

Last year the key area to improve was to create a culture where parents and school were working together to meet the needs of the children and improve attainment. The appointment of a Pupil Premium Champion to work holistically with families has been very successful. Careful tracking and regular evaluation have enabled the school to identify and address personalised needs.

Strengths:

- Access to extra-curricular and enrichment activities
- Improved engagement in reading for pleasure
- Phonics attainment
- Parental engagement
- Pupil well-being

Key actions for 2019-2020

- Focus on Early Years and Year 1 children to make accelerated progress and to pass phonics screening
- Additional speech and language support
- More focussed support in maths to improve progress
- PP Champion to support pupils by giving regular, individual feedback

Barriers to future attainment

The multiple disadvantages of pupils (e.g. SEN/CP/EAL) who are also eligible for PP.

Lack of engagement with the school (i.e. attendance at meet the teacher sessions, curriculum workshops, parent consultations and class cafes).

The mental health and resilience of children and their parents may be a barrier to attainment.

Unsupported learning habits at home e.g. the home may lack resources for learning, pupils may not have had reading modelled to them and homework may not be adequately supported.

Family structures may be broken.

Safeguarding and welfare issues which may lead to Social Services involvement.

Mental health issues or social and emotional issues in the family and/or child.

Some pupils' attendance is low and some are frequently late so are missing learning.

Parents may lack skills in parenting.

Communication and language barriers due to language delay or speech and language issues identified by a Speech and Language Therapist.
