Imperative verbs	Have you used imperative (bossy) verbs to begin your instructions? e.g.
(bossy)	Firstly, <u>collect</u> the droppings from the Soupee bird.
Short, clear sentences	Have you written short, clear sentences giving the instruction?
Warning/helpful hint	Have you ended with a warning or helpful hint to add interest to the
