Friday PE	To move fluently, changing direction and speed	Warm up – stuck in the mud and stretches Today, we are focussing on the skill of dodging – moving away from an opponent by quickly changing speed or direction, or both. Ask 2 children to demonstrate playing rabbits. The child with the tag needs to remember to always run into a space, avoiding their partner and the other children.
