It's the average weather in a place over a number of years – find out more: https://kids.britannica.com/kids/article/climate/352972.</p> <p>Use lesson 4 from the PowerPoint: Tanzania is just south of the equator and its climate is tropical, so it is hot all year round. On the coast, the weather is usually hot and humid with lots of rainfall, but the central area is much drier. There are two rainy seasons – 'long': March, April, May and 'short': November and December.</p>	Write about what a tropical climate is like – hot all year, and wet - and how it differs from our temperate climate - cool, wet winters and warm, wet summers.
